Appointed Special Advocates

CASA OF LANCASTER
AND LEBANON COUNTIES

Funding was allocated to CASA of Lancaster and Lebanon Counties to develop and implement a **Preventative Advocacy Pilot Program**. This program will expand CASA's best-interest child advocacy efforts to include specific private custody cases that are "dependency adjacent," meaning they have a current or historical connection with Children and Youth Services.

The goal is to intervene early in these cases, potentially preventing the need for out-of-home placements and reducing trauma for the children and their families.

Lititz Chooses Love received funding to establish and implement **Name Change Clinics**, providing legal assistance and guidance to transgender and non-binary individuals navigating the legal name change process.





Zion Community Services received support for their Lancaster County Pardon Project, which aims to hold one clinic per week throughout the year. This initiative seeks to remove barriers to employment, housing, and educational opportunities, enhancing the lives of individuals with criminal records, and ultimately fostering a stronger and more resilient community.



Support is provided for a Family Law Attorney for MidPenn Legal Services' Safe at Home Program.

This program helps ensure that children remain in safe and stable home and school environments by facilitating clear custody agreements among family members.

Funding was awarded to raise awareness of YWCA
Lancaster's Sexual Assault Prevention and
Counseling Center and its essential legal resources
in Lancaster County. The grant will also support their
Legal Advocacy Project, which provides legal
workshops for community members.





This grant funding will support the Lancaster Bar Association's **Translation Access Program**, which ensures that all Lancaster County residents, regardless of their primary language, have equal access to vital legal information.

The program focuses on translating resources for the Lawyer Referral Service, including legal documents, educational materials, and other key resources into the languages most commonly spoken in the community. By providing these translations, the program helps non-English speaking individuals better understand their rights and more effectively navigate the legal system.



Community Outreach



Our **Law Suits** donation program collects business clothing for community members in need, providing them with attire suitable for interviews and professional work environments.

We created and maintain the **Comfort Rooms at the Lancaster County Courthouse**. These rooms
allow children a safe haven to relax and escape the
stress-inducing environment of the courtrooms and
hallways.



We organize **Operation Santa** and bring Christmas to the residents of the Transitional Living Center. We surprise them with a holiday party and donate gifts for the children & residents.

By making these materials accessible, we are empowering individuals to make informed decisions about their legal rights and responsibilities.

Pro Bono

We participate in the **Name Change Clinic** program providing legal assistance and guidance to transgender and non-binary individuals navigating the legal name change process.





We participate in the **Wills for Heroes** program which provides free basic estate planning documents to first responders and veterans.

Community Education



Our attorneys frequently speak at public school events and present educational programs. The Lancaster Law Foundation **Speakers Bureau** collaborates with local community groups and schools to provide attorneys for these educational initiatives.

The Lancaster Law Foundation educates about **Law Day** - and we're adding a **Law Day Poster Contest** for 2025! We also create public awareness and appreciation opportunities for **Juror Appreciation Week**.
